In these two exhibitions, you will find prints made by artists from the 1960s and 1970s, and videos made by contemporary artists. Through their artworks these artists communicate messages, express ideas and share information with a large audience.

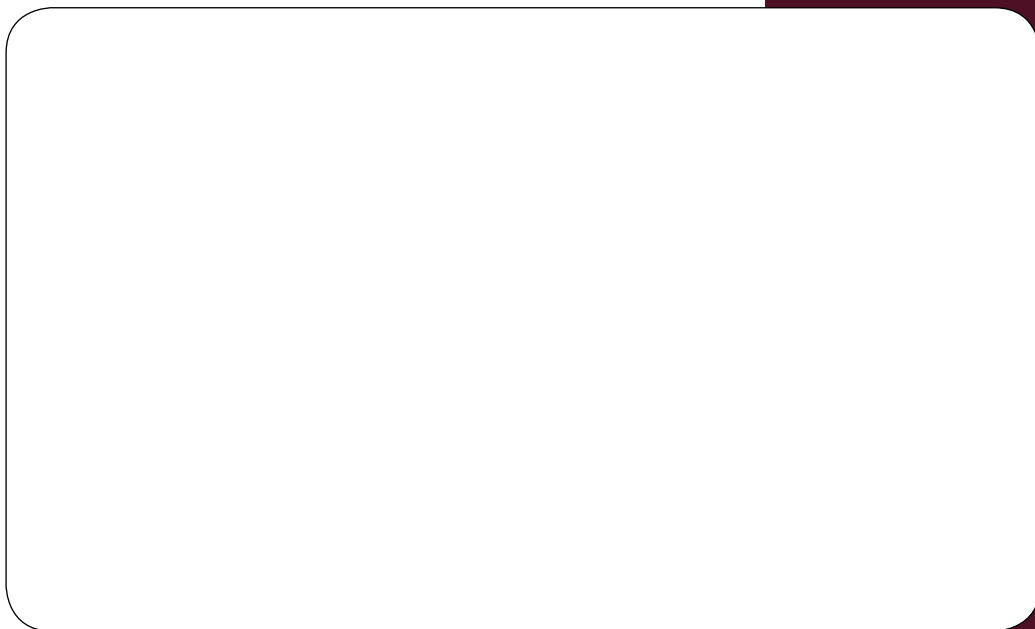
Using this activity sheet, Adults **(A)** can explore the exhibition with children **(C)** and help them form their own ideas about the artworks on display.

1. (A) & (C) Find the collection of prints by **Sir Eduardo Paolozzi**. He used collage to layout the design of these prints, borrowing images from magazines and comics. Collage is a way to make art, where the artwork is made from an assemblage of different forms, creating a new image.
